4. Design accessible travel experiences. We at Blossom IDD believe that individuals can flourish and grow so much through travel (independent from their families). Learning and growing in skills such as problem solving, independent living, time management, money management, and more, we design experiences that support individuals in exploring with their peers.

5. Collaborate on comprehensive life planning. Life is not just about work or having a social life, it encompasses so much more. Blossom IDD works with families and individuals with ensure they are living life to the fullest in all areas.
